On July 1, Fresno County slashed homecare workers wages from \$10.25 to \$9.50 an hour. SEIU might have been able to stop the cut if they'd been paying more attention to representing members.

That's what SEIU said in San Francisco.

Nursing home workers at Laguna Honda are now are facing wage cuts of \$6 per hour—\$13,000 a year—after SEIU failed to respond to three requests by the City and County to bargain over a job reclassification.
